

The Southern New Mexico Square Dance Community has lost too many of its members this year. In addition to Wilson Purcella and Gerald Tibbs, we lost Fred Edgington to a stroke on October 6th, 2007. He and Billie were in Winston-Salem, NC to attend the wedding of her niece.

Fred will be greatly missed by Blue Bell Square Dance Club. Both he and Billie gave a great deal of support to the club. If we needed someone to serve as an officer, an Angel for lessons, help to decorate for a special dance, someone to help refinish the floor at the Bridge Center, they were always there.

Fred, along with many others, was instrumental in installing the floating wood floor at the Bridge Center where we cur-

rently dance. We may have been able to do the job without Fred (not so sure), but it would **definitely not** have been as much fun. Fred was something of a workaholic, and I enjoyed talking to him about the latest project. It could be a rock wall or clearing a pad on his land, or one of a thousand other things. I don't think that there was anything that he hadn't tried. I'm sorry that he won't have the opportunity to build that house up on the hill. I know that it would have been a very special house.

I think that everyone who ever danced in a square with Fred will agree that there was definitely no square dancer that had more fun or enjoyment dancing than Fred. It will be especially hard when a dance includes "Sides Face, Grand Square".

Fred started square dancing when he was in College and became a member of the exhibition team at the University of Colorado. After graduation he came to Las Cruces in the late 1950's to work at White Sands Proving Grounds. It was there that he met some co-workers that were members of Blue Bell Square Dance Club. He and Billie have been club members since the late 1960's. There are only three couples that have been members longer than Fred and Billie.

I know that his passing will leave a great void in the hearts of all who knew him. But, I for one know, that when the Good Lord says, "Square'em Up!", Fred will be the first one there. Thank You Fred, for sharing your life with us. - Jim Groves

Fred Marion Edgington - (December 5, 1932 - October 6, 2007)

Mr. Fred Marion Edgington, 74, of Las Cruces died Saturday, Oct. 6, 2007 in Winston-Salem, NC unexpectedly. Mr. Edgington was born Dec. 1932 in Longmont, CO, son of the late Fred Marion and Mildred Payne Edgington. He served his country in the U.S. Army during the 1950's in Germany and received an honorable discharge. After graduating as a Mechanical Engineer from University of Colorado, he came to Las Cruces to work for White Sands Missile range where he worked until he retired for the first time. He greatly enjoyed working with all the people at his current job at EMI. He was an avid duplicate bridge player, and a square dancer from college until the present. He was a member of the Optimist Club for many years. He was genuinely loved by all his family and friends. A son, Scott David Edgington, preceded Mr. Edgington in death. Surviving is his wife, Billie Anne Edington and mother-in-law Nell Edington of the family home, his children: Cammie Howard and her husband Mark, Andreas Boesel and wife Shari, daughter-in-law Carol Edgington. His grandchildren: Kevin Edgington, Alex and Ian Howard, Charles Edgington and wife Paige, and Taryn McNeely and husband Patrick.
